

The club has a caravan license for 75 units for vacational occupation between 1st March and 31st October. Unlike many caravan parks our sites are not arranged in regimented rows with just a few metres in between, but instead they are spread out throughout our 26 acres of woodland; this can be seen in the aerial photo of the club's grounds on the home page of our website (the tiny white rectangles are Static Caravans).

Once a member rents a site, they can continue to rent it for their exclusive use for as long as they are members. Site rents for 2019 are £135 p.a.

The club's affairs are managed by a General Committee elected by, and from, the members once a year at the Annual General Meeting. This Committee controls the allocation of sites and what can be put on them. Members are required to keep their site neat and tidy and in good order.

Some members have static caravans, others bring on tourer caravans, and there are a small number of wooden chalets.



There is an abundance of 2nd hand statics in the local area, aged 10 years or older, which come from commercial sites continually updating their stocks. Typically, such 2nd hand statics cost between £2000 and £4000, including delivery to the club's grounds. Looked after, they can last for years.

We cannot have any more chalets so those we have are sold from one member to another, subject to the Committee agreeing to a transfer of the site rental to the new owner. As you can imagine, they don't change hands very often, and attract great interest when they do!



All the sites have a mains water supply. The club has its own supply of LPG (Propane and Butane) Cylinders, at greatly discounted prices.

Currently there are a few vacant sites. New members joining us can apply to maintain a site during the period of their trial membership; subject to various rules this means the site is reserved for them to rent on an on-going basis if and when they become full members.
